### ABOUT THE CENTRE

The Centre is a Senate approved research centre within the University of British Columbia and affiliated with Vancouver Coastal Health Research Institute. On November 28, 2022, the VCHRI Council voted unanimously to support the name change to **Centre for** Aging SMART (Solutions for Mobility, Activity, Rehabilitation and Technology) at Vancouver Coastal **Health**. The name change was a direct response to the 2020 External Review. which strongly recommended rebranding the Centre with aging as the umbrella to more accurately reflect its work and its strategic direction.
